**Biographical Summary**

Clement Mechack Peter Oniang'o is a full Professor of Philosophy and researcher at the University of Nairobi, Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies, with a strong background in Biological Sciences at Wisconsin State University Stevens Point, USA, Undergraduate training, and Philosophy and Postgraduate training at Washington State University Pullman, USA, Columbia University N.Y. and Makerere University, Kampala. He currently teaches Philosophy (Metaphysics and Epistemology), Ethics, Social and Political Philosophy, Philosophy of Science, and Philosophy of Law, at the University of Nairobi. He has been Visiting Professor in the Institute for the History & Philosophy of Science & Technology (IHPST) University of Toronto (Canada) in the Fall Semester (August – December 2006). He has also taught Philosophy at Washington State University (USA), Loop College Chicago (USA), Millsaps College (USA), Tougaloo College (USA), Makerere University (Kampala, Uganda) and Kenyatta University (Kenya). He has served as external examiner of Department of Philosophy at Universities of Zimbabwe, Zambia and Makerere.
