Samuel Owuor is an Associate Professor of Urban Geography in the Department of Geography, Population and Environmental Studies of the University of Nairobi. He holds a PhD in Human Geography (University of Amsterdam), MA in Urban Geography (McGill University/University of Nairobi), and BA in Geography (University of Nairobi). Since his employment at the University of Nairobi in 1995, he has gained considerable experience in university teaching and training, scientific research and publications, and supervision and external examination of graduate students. He has served in a number of university management and leadership positions, including serving as Head of the Department of Geography and Environmental Studies (2011-2017).

He is a scholar with international experience, exposure and networks.
